## The Month of June....

The month of June brings beautiful bouquets, delicious fruits and vegetables, and an urge to get out there and enjoy the sunshine.

June was most likely named for the Roman goddess Juno, patroness of marriage and the well-being of women. Another interpretation says that the name came from the Latin *juvenis*, “young people,” who were celebrated at this time.

There is a term called, June Bug, which is given to many large bugs found in the United States, during May and June.

The bugs get this name because the transition of larva to adult happens in this month. These are usually seen in the dark when they are attracted to light. The month of June is said to have more daylight hours than every other month of the year, but this is exclusive to the northern hemisphere as in the southern hemisphere, it has the least daylight hours.

June is the host to Wimbledon, the popular English tennis tournament. It is arguably one of the most prominent tennis tournaments in the world. It is unofficially celebrated as the National Smile Month in the United Kingdom.

According to a study, June has about 6% of present CEOs born in it. The traditional Anglo-Saxons called the month of June the “sera monath”, which when roughly translated means the dry month. This is quite understandable considering the season.

On the 5th of June, World Environment Day is held to spread awareness about the environment and how to preserve it.

On the 7th of June, National Chocolate Ice Cream day is celebrated by people who fancy it.

On the 15th of June, Chocolate Eclair is celebrated.

On the 16th of June, Fresh Veggies day is celebrated to encourage a healthy eating lifestyle.

On the 20th of June, Ice Cream Soda day is celebrated.

### Peace Be With You

Summer is coming and the month of June is traditionally a time to take a break or vacation. Time off from work and school is a special gift that we treasure, and it can even be a time to enhance our spiritual life. In fact, if we take a good look at our lives, we can see that everything we have is a gift from God. He created us and so all we do comes from Him.

The Holy Catholic Church understands this and, by God's design, we have many opportunities to strengthen our faith and understanding and grow our relationship with Jesus. Throughout this month of June our Church gives us many Memorials and Solemnities at both the daily and Sunday Masses. The first Solemnity, and a very important one is Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the descent of the Holy Spirit, as tongues of fire, over the apostles. This day we often refer to as the beginning of or birth of the Holy Catholic Church. The very next day we will celebrate the memorial of The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church.

The following Sunday is the Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity. As Catholics, each time we begin and end a prayer we sign ourselves "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". We acknowledge the Holy Trinity constantly. In this day's Gospel passage Jesus will tell the apostles "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when He comes, the Spirit of Truth, He will guide you to all Truth." (Jn.16:12-13) When we ask, He still guides us today "to all truth".

The third Sunday of this month we will celebrate the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or what we commonly refer to as "Corpus Christi". Time and time again we read in the Gospels how Jesus is the bread of life especially when He takes five (5) loaves of bread and two (2) fish and feeds the five thousand. He fed and nourished the thousands from virtually nothing and He continues to nourish us today in Sacred Scripture, which is the Word, and in the Holy Eucharist, which is the Word made flesh. He does this so that we can follow Him to the eternal banquet.

Other Solemnities that the Church has wisely provided for us this month are: The Nativity of John the Baptist, The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and Saints Peter and Paul., with another Memorial of The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Yes, vacation time is here. And we are also in a time that The Church wants us to grow in Faith. The world today is filled with all kinds of violence, hate and "wokeness" and always trying to invent some other kind of truth. The current culture of this world is working very hard to deny **Real Truth**. It is the Truth of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. For this world it is an inconvenient Truth. Peace be with you. What do you think?

### WHO IS DEACON DAN ?

Deacon Dan was born in New York City, New York on May 3, 1949. In his early years he lived in the Bronx and then moved to Westchester county until junior high when his father was transferred to San Francisco. He went to Catholic schools from elementary school through college. He participated in ROTC in college after which he went into the Army in 1973 was stationed at Letterman Army Medical Facility in San Francisco, Fort Jackson in South Carolina and Ft Sill in Oklahoma. Before entering the active duty army Deacon Dan studied and became a physical therapist at the University of Iowa after which he practiced for over 40 years. He later got a Masters degree from Pepperdine University. Upon exiting active duty, Deacon Dan had a decision to make as to where he wanted to settle down. He traveled to many places but as a young man the beautiful beaches of San Diego and the then small town feel of San Diego prevailed.

Deacon Dan and his wife Suzanne will have been married for 40 years this September. It was Suzanne who encouraged him to look into the diaconate and to travel to Medjugorje, Yugoslavia after hearing about the apparitions of Mary there. While there Deacon Dan received his calling in hearing Mary's call to take care of her children. In June of this year he will celebrate his 29th anniversary, every year of which has been dedicated to that call to take care of her children. He has served as a deacon in San Diego for 1 year, Polson, Montana for 19 years and Tucson for 9 years, which is where he retired before coming to St. Catherine Laboure 2 years ago. When he arrived in Prescott, he petitioned the Diocese of Phoenix to be a deacon here and obtained faculties to do so in March of this year.

P.S. I am looking forward to working with the people of St. Catherine Laboure in whatever capacity needed. Please keep in mind that I am God's servant and as such I am here to serve you. Let me know how I can serve you or I won't know what your needs are. I am still trying to settle into how things are done here. I know I may do things a little bit different than you are accustomed to. Please be patient. I will work to be the light of Christ for you, and I look forward to seeing the face of God in you.

### La Paz Esté Con Ustedes

Se acerca el verano y el mes de junio es tradicionalmente un momento de descanso o vacaciones. El tiempo libre del trabajo y la escuela es un regalo especial que atesoramos e incluso puede ser un momento para mejorar nuestra vida espiritual. De hecho, si miramos bien nuestra vida podemos ver que todo lo que tenemos es un regalo de Dios. Él nos creó y todo lo que hacemos viene de Él.

La Santa Iglesia Católica entiende esto y, por el diseño de Dios, tenemos muchas oportunidades para fortalecer nuestra fe y comprensión y hacer crecer nuestra relación con Jesús. A lo largo de este mes de junio nuestra Iglesia nos regala muchos Memoriales y Solemnidades tanto en las Misas diarias como Dominicales. La primera Solemnidad, y muy importante, es el Domingo de Pentecostés. En este día recordamos la venida del Espíritu Santo, como lenguas de fuego, sobre los apóstoles. A menudo nos referimos a este día como el comienzo o el nacimiento de la Santa Iglesia Católica. Al día siguiente celebraremos la memoria de la Santísima Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia.

El domingo siguiente es la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad. Como católicos, cada vez que comenzamos y terminamos una oración nos firmamos "En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo". Reconocemos a la Santísima Trinidad constantemente. En el pasaje del Evangelio de este día, Jesús les dirá a los apóstoles: "Tengo muchas cosas que decirles, pero todavía no las pueden comprender. Pero cuando venga el Espíritu de la Verdad, Él los irá guiando hasta la Verdad". (Jn.16:12-13) Cuando pedimos, Él nos guía todavía hoy "a toda la verdad".

El tercer domingo de este mes celebraremos la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo o lo que comúnmente llamamos "Corpus Christi". Una y otra vez leemos en los Evangelios cómo Jesús es el pan de vida, especialmente cuando toma cinco (5) panes y dos (2) peces y alimenta a los cinco mil. Él alimentó y alimentó a miles de personas prácticamente de la nada y continúa alimentándonos hoy en la Sagrada Escritura, que es la Palabra, y en la Sagrada Eucaristía, que es la Palabra hecha carne. Él hace esto para que podamos seguirlo al banquete eterno.

Otras Solemnidades que sabiamente la Iglesia nos ha provisto este mes son: La Natividad de Juan Bautista, El Sacratísimo Corazón de Jesús y San Pedro y San Pablo, con otra Memoria del Inmaculado Corazón de la Santísima Virgen María.

Sí, el tiempo de vacaciones está aquí. Y, también estamos en un tiempo que La Iglesia quiere que crezcamos en la Fe. El mundo de hoy está lleno de todo tipo de violencia y odio y siempre está tratando de inventar algún otro tipo de verdad. La cultura actual de este mundo está trabajando muy duro para negar la Verdad real. Es la Verdad de Dios Padre, Dios Hijo y Dios Espíritu Santo. Para este mundo es una Verdad inconveniente. La paz esté con ustedes. ¿Qué piensas?

### BIOGRAFIA DEL DIACONO DAN

El Diacono Dan nació en la ciudad de Nueva York, Nueva York el 3 de Mayo de 1949. Pasó sus primeros años en Bronx y luego cuando estaba en la prepa y su papá fue transferido a San Francisco se cambió al condado de Westchester.

El Diacono Dan fue a escuela Católica desde su primaria hasta terminar sus estudios académicos. Participó en la ROTC en el colegio y después entró en el ejército en 1973; fue cartero del ejército de la Armada Medica en San Francisco, en Fort Jackson en Sur de Carolina y en Ft. Sill en Oklahoma. Antes de entrar en el ejército el Diacono Dan estudió Físico Terapeuta en la Universidad de Iowa lo cual practicó por 40 años. Más tarde hizo su Maestría en la Universidad de Pepperdine.

Después de darse de baja en el ejército, el diacono tenía que tomar una decisión de donde quería establecerse. Viajó mucho de joven y le encantaron las playas de San Diego, la cual, en aquel entonces era una ciudad chica.

El Diacono Dan y su esposa Suzanne cumplirían 40 años de casados este Septiembre. Fue Suzanne quien le aconsejó que entrara al diaconado y fuera a Medjugorje Yugoslavia después de haber oído sobre las apariciones. Cuando estaba ahí, recibió el llamado de la Virgen María de cuidar a sus hijos. En Junio celebrará sus 29 años al servicio de la Iglesia como diacono. Diacono Dan sirvió 1 año en San Diego, Polson; Montana por 19 años y Tucson por 9 años de donde se retiró antes de venir a Santa Catherine hace 2 años. Cuando llegó a Prescott, pidió a la Diócesis de Phoenix hacerse diacono aquí en Marzo de este año.

**Finance Council**



### **June 2022: Month of the Sacred Heart**

This prayer is often said on or around the Feast of the Sacred Heart. In it, we unite ourselves fully to the Heart of Christ, asking Him to purify our wills so that everything we do may be in line with His Will—and, if we fall, that His Love and Mercy may shield us from the righteous judgment of God the Father.

#### **Prayer to the Sacred Heart**

Hail! O Sacred Heart of Jesus, living and quickening source of eternal life, infinite treasure of the Divinity, and burning furnace of divine love. Thou art my refuge and my sanctuary, O my amiable Savior. Consume my heart with that burning fire with which Thine is ever inflamed. Pour down on my soul those graces which flow from Thy love, and let my heart be so united with Thine, that our wills may be one, and mine in all things, be conformed to Thine. May Thy divine will be equally the standard and rule of all my desires and of all my actions. Amen.

#### **Memorare to the Sacred Heart**

Remember, O most sweet Jesus, that no one who has had recourse to Thy Sacred Heart, implored its help, or sought its mercy was ever abandoned. Encouraged with confidence, O tenderest of hearts, we present ourselves before Thee, crushed beneath the weight of our sins. In our misery, O Sacred Heart of Jesus, despise not our simple prayers, but mercifully grant our requests. Amen.

#### **An Explanation of the Memorare to the Sacred Heart**

A "Memorare" is a particular type of prayer that, in Latin, always begins with the word *Memorare* ("Call to mind" or "Remember"). In this Memorare to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we ask Christ to look not at our sins but to hear our request for a special favor.
